POLYCO'S PURPOSE

- Our role as a NPC is to reduce plastic packaging to landfill by increasing the sustainable collection, recycling and beneficiation of polyolefin plastics, polymers 2(HDPE), 4 (LL and LDPE) and 5 (PP)
- We do this to fulfil the extended producer responsibility requirements of the polyolefin packaging industry in order to meet the IWMP recycling rate target of 35% or 238 000 te's by 2020.



THE INFORMAL SECTOR IS CHALLENGING: POLYCO's FINDINGS

Challenges:

- 1. Volume growth tends to be small with high rand/ton ratio
- 2.Lot of inexperienced applicants or start up operations
- 3. Many requests for trucks or working capital
- 4. Many want to add more value but don't have the know-how or capital i.e., move from collector to recycler
- 5.Is has directly affected S-A-S initiatives supported by POLYCO Positives:
- 1.By supporting collection SMME's, it directly creates more demand from the informal sector
- 2.Employment opportunities created
- 3. The establishment of buy back centres/ drop off areas in "unserviced" areas is important for growth of new source
- 4. Opportunity to upskill this sector to add more value



COLLECTION PROJECTS 2015:

- Awarded R4,6 million in August 2015
- 1.R850K in grants to the informal sector
- 2.R3,8 million in interest –free loans to SMME's
