Market overview

In South Africa:

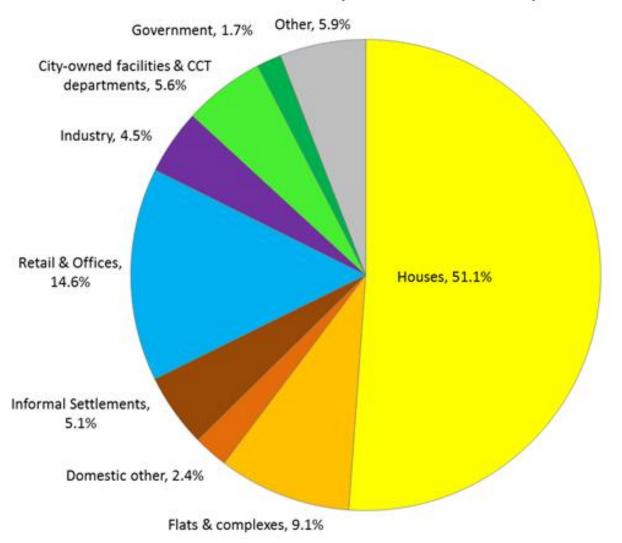
- Residential users spent ~R27bn on municipal water and sanitation services (2016)
- Commercial and industrial businesses spent ~R16bn (2016)
- R30bn* worth of new buildings were completed Jan-Jun 2018, of which ~R900m on wet services

In Cape Town:

- Residential use ~67% of total water use
- >40% of households water is free of charge
- Only ~10,000 non-indigent homes used >20kl/month in April 2018
- Commercial and industrial users will spend an estimated R2.7bn on water and sanitation charges in 2018**

Cape Town Water use:

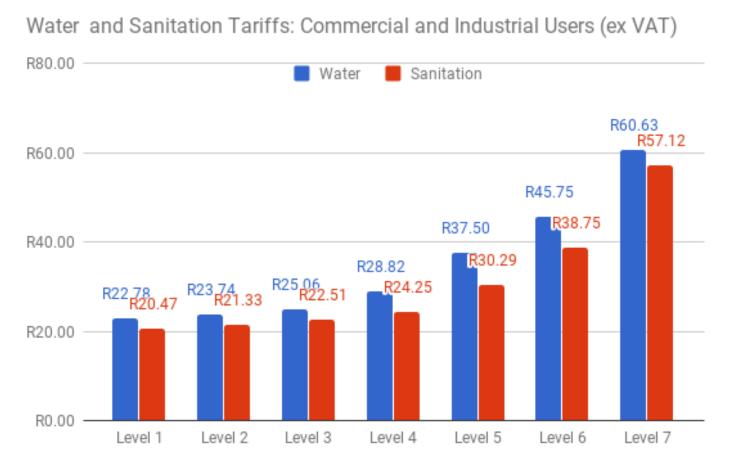
Potable water consumption by use category (01.07.2017 - 30.06.2018)

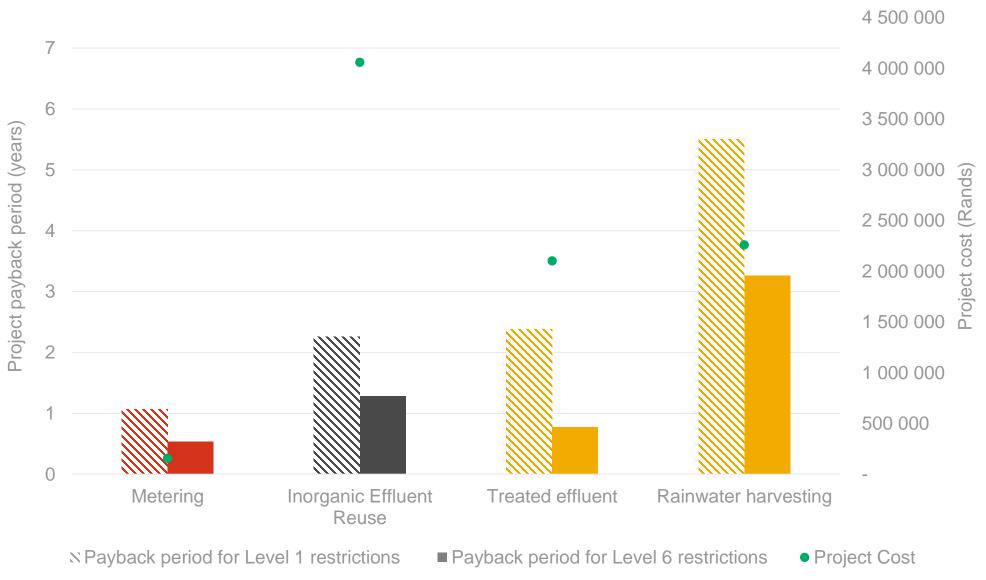
- Risks of insufficient water supply
