

Event-ual Landfill Diversion

Case Study 001



WISP worked with the World Economic Forum to divert 11.8 tonnes of event waste from landfill, creating nearly R250,000 in economic benefits, and various social spinoffs.

The Organisations

World Economic Forum

The Challenge

Every two years, the World Economic Forum (WEF) holds a meeting of global leaders in Cape Town. In 2015, the event was held at the Cape Town International Conference Centre (CTICC). The CTICC has a well-established waste management plan, but management of tear-down waste is not included and as such was the responsibility of the WEF. These resources included an estimated 12 tonnes of clean pine planks, 500m2 carpeting, treated fabrics used for event set up, and excess promotional material.

The Solution

The WEF sought WISP's help to divert tear-down waste. Two months before the event, the types and volumes of resources to be used to set up the event were identified. This helped WISP estimate the waste that would be produced and identify a selection of solution providers that would work with the CTICC's on-site waste management company to divert the WEF event waste from landfill. The solution providers included:

Wood: Furntech and Combo Timbers used the pine wood to manufacture furniture and pallets for sale. Plant People used the wood to help repair flooring for informal housing in Hout Bay, Cape Town.

Carpeting: True-North reused the event's carpeting to carpet one of its community schools for underprivileged children.

Promotional Pamphlets: Kunye were able to use promotional material to craft jewellery boxes.

Banners: Learn to Earn manufactured event bags made from recycled PVC banners for the WEF's staff. The income from the sale of the bags to the WEF were used to continue providing assistance in training the unemployed members of society in life and business skills.

The Benefits

ECONOMIC BENEFITS



- WEF saved R20k on waste service costs; companies saved c.R29.6k by using secondhand timber
- c.R193k additional revenue was generated
- Total economic spinoff from exchanges c.R242k

ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS



- 11.8 tonnes (83%) of exhibition waste diverted from landfill.
- 10 tonnes of fossil greenhouse gas savings in terms of carbon dioxide

SOCIAL BENEFITS



- Two temporary jobs created as a result of wood collection
- Wood resources used to facilitate woodwork skills training for 60 unemployed/disabled learners
- Support organisations that teach unemployed persons life and business skills
- Better the lives of the underprivileged by providing material for building maintenance in Imizamo Yethu
